I hope this update finds you well as we settle into the winter season here in Central Alberta. It's important to me. and to all of us at the Joffre Site, to keep you updated on developments and to express our gratitude for your ongoing support and engagement with our operations.

Earlier this spring, an exciting announcement was made regarding the future of our company. Borouge Group International (BGI) will be created through the combination of Borouge, Borealis, and the acquisition of NOVA Chemicals—pending regulatory approvals. BGI

will have its headquarters in Vienna, Austria, with regional hubs in the UAE, Canada (Calgary), the United States, and Singapore. Once established, BGI is set to become the fourth-largest polyolefins producer in the world. We anticipate "Day 1" for BGI in the first quarter of 2026, subject to receiving all necessary approvals. Rest assured, we will share more detailed information with you as soon as these approvals are finalized, and we appreciate your patience and interest during this period of transition.

Our commitment to our community remains strong. We recently wrapped up our 30th United Way campaign and thanks to the generosity and dedication of our employees and retirees, we raised over \$710,000 to support vital programs and services across Central Alberta. This achievement speaks

volumes about the caring spirit that defines our people.

2026 Joffre Site Planned Maintenance

In 2026, our Ethylene 1 facility will undergo turnaround maintenance. We also have a few small outages which will enable us to complete some work outside of the day-to-day maintenance in our Advanced SCLAIRTECH™ Technology Facility 1 (AST1) and Polyethylene 1 (PE1) facilities.

What can you expect?

- Potential flaring during plant shutdown and start-up
- Increased traffic on roadways

AST1 outage in Spring, 10–14-day duration **E1 Turnaround in May**, 48-day duration **PE1 two outages in Spring and Fall**, each 7–12 days in duration

Our focus is always on minimizing impacts on the community, and we will take necessary actions to ensure we meet that commitment.

CELEBRATING 50 YEARS IN PETROCHEMICALS

50 YEAR ANNIVERSARY NOVA Chemicals

A combined 52 years of service to NOVA from three generations at the Joffre Site

The journey began with **Clarence McParland**, who dedicated 21 years to NOVA before retiring in 2007. His son-in-law **Stacy Kirstein** continued the tradition and who celebrated 25 years at NOVA in August. Meanwhile, **Cameron Kirstein**, the most recent generation to embark on his career at NOVA, is eager to carry forward the family's legacy and make his own mark.

Clarence joined NOVA in the latter part of his career in 1986. When asked what made NOVA stand out prior to joining the organization, he said what made NOVA stand out was their reputation for a great working environment. Clarence spent his career at NOVA as an electrician.

When Stacy married Natalie, Clarence's daughter, NOVA wasn't his first move. After a few years in the oilfield services, he found himself at a crossroads. It was the late 90's, and oil was at \$11 per barrel. Stacy, like many at the time, was laid off. With a young family, his father-in-law encouraged him to go back to school and get his diploma in Power Engineering. After completing his first year, Stacy landed a practicum at NOVA. At the time, the role was unpaid, and his family was back in Edmonton, so Stacy would head home on the rare day off between working his shifts at NOVA and taking on other odd jobs.

During his practicum, Stacy worked with a great team and made the decision that NOVA was where he wanted to land after he finished his program. As his practicum came to an end, a full-time position opened up at the Joffre Site. Stacy put his name in for consideration and ended up getting the job. He moved his family back to Red Deer from Edmonton, and the rest is history. Over the next few years, Stacy and Clarence worked together on occasion until Clarence retired (and if you caught the two on the same shift you might've heard Stacy lovingly referred to as 'Meat Head' by his father in-law).

Then, six years ago, Cameron joined the operations team for one of NOVA's ethylene units in Joffre. Looking forward, he hopes to have the same longevity his dad and grandpa have had at NOVA.

Premier Smith helps Joffre Site Celebrate 50 Years



In June, NOVA Chemicals and the Government of Alberta marked a historic milestone with the unveiling of a commemorative plaque at NOVA Chemicals' Joffre manufacturing site, celebrating 50 years of petrochemical innovation, partnership, and progress in the province.

Premier Danielle Smith and Lacombe-Ponoka MLA Jennifer Johnson toured the world-scale facilities alongside NOVA executives and reflected on the legacy of Alberta's first ethylene plant, E1 — approved in 1975 under then-Premier Peter Lougheed's visionary leadership.

The commissioning of the E1 ethylene cracker marked the beginning of Alberta's value-added petrochemical industry. Ethylene, a foundational building block of plastics, enabled NOVA Chemicals to evolve into the leader in polyethylene production that it is today. This milestone laid the groundwork for NOVA's long-term commitment to innovation, sustainability, and circularity.

Since its founding, NOVA Chemicals has evolved from a prairie pipeline company into a global leader in polyethylene production, recycling solutions, and the circular economy. With deep roots in Alberta and the support of more than 1,400 Alberta-based employees, the company's 50th anniversary recognizes the people, partnerships, and progress that have shaped its journey.

The commemorative plaque will serve as a permanent tribute to the pioneering decision that launched Alberta's petrochemical industry and to the generations of employees who have helped shape the province's petrochemical success story.

NOVA's Community Nature Trail Celebrates 10 Years

The NOVA Chemicals Community Nature Trail opened in 2015 to be an environmental legacy of the Polyethylene 1 Expansion project. Since the trail opened, thousands of community members and employees have enjoyed the trail year-round! The trail features 5KM of looped trails, a picnic area, bridges and interpretive signage. The trail was constructed for the community and employees to connect with nature and learn about local wildlife and plants. Improvements over the years include an educational pollinator trail (2018) and naturalized pond improvements (2019). In 2016, the project was a finalist for the Alberta Emerald Awards.
